There may be no better word to describe SHALOM 2023 than growth. Growth is part of the legacy of SHALOM, starting small with Glen and Sara Collison's desire to share the love of Jesus by providing a loving family home for adults living with disabilities. We have seen God multiply that desire a hundredfold and continue to do so in 2023.

We now serve 40 Participants per day at the SHALOM Woolery, with approximately 30 volunteers serving weekly, alongside 11 coaches. The **SHALOM** Farm continues to thrive with BIG plans coming in the next couple of years.

SHALOM Coffee Connection opened in March on Fridays and Saturdays. Five part-time coaches are on rotation to work alongside one volunteer and one or two Participants per shift. Seventeen Participants have been trained to serve as baristas! SHALOM Coffee was a dream come true for SHALOM resident Karen and her care provider Julie Stevens. SHALOM's newly licensed kitchen at the Shepherd's Barn empowers them and volunteer Sandy Hart to bake cookies together for the coffee shop weekly.

The Connection Depot Thrift Store continues to exceed all expectations with growth year after year under the leadership of the Lohmans and many dedicated volunteers!

Multiple Service Teams assisted SHALOM in a variety of projects including major updates and landscaping to our Groveland home, painting at Polk St., increasing pasture fencing, and wood splitting for spring sap boiling.

Friday Night Fun Nights were initiated to provide SHALOM caregivers three hours of respite twice per month. The Meal Blessings Team and the Worship Transportation Team, respectively, operated for the full year providing meals to SHALOM homes four times per month, and driving Participants to SHALOM Worship monthly.

SHALOM Worship celebrated 10 years! The River Church faithfully provided pizza and worshiped Jesus with

SHALOM all throughout 2023! In the past 12 months, we added much needed staff hours with Barb Patterson as Administrative Assistant/HR and Sheila Brown as our Community Liaison to support our growing community needs.

Each of the above SHALOM ministry areas requires major support and interest from volunteers. *The people of* SHALOM thank you from the bottom of our hearts! SHALOM continues to operate debt free thanks to so many wonderful partners who have shared not only financially but with their "lives as well" (2 Thessalonians 2:8). May God continue to grow us in the image of Jesus in 2024!

Community Partnership

We are grateful for many opportunities to live into the mission God has called us to. One of our community partners is the Young Adult Program (YAP) from Kalamazoo Regional Educational Service Agency (KRESA).

Every Wednesday a group of teachers and students comes to SHALOM to learn and serve alongside SHALOM Participants, coaches, and volunteers. They learn skills on the SHALOM Farm and Woolery. Plus, there is an opportunity for YAP students and SHALOM Participants to work alongside each other, learning and growing together.

Jenna, who leads the YAP program, wrote a letter of thanks to SHALOM recently for the experience YAP students have had while attending on Wednesdays.

Dear SHALOM,

The partnership between KRESA's Young Adult Program (YAP) and SHALOM has grown and been a defining part of YAP

students' learning experience. Over the past ten years, we have seen students gain critical employment, job task skills, and social skills while becoming more wellrounded young adults.

Words cannot express the impact that SHALOM staff, residents, Participants, and volunteers have had on our students. YAP students have



gained skills in gardening, farming, and art/crafting activities while being mentored by SHALOM Participants. The peer modeling our students have received from SHALOM has been invaluable in building connections and friendships that will continue into their lives post-YAP.

For our students at YAP who need a safe space to explore and learn community and employment skills, the opportunity to join and participate in the activities at SHALOM has been life changing. This opportunity has allowed them to get out of the classroom, be part of something bigger, and access their community in ways they have not been able to before creating a community that is truly inclusive. The compassion, empathy, and understanding SHALOM has shown YAP students is genuinely moving.

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VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHT: SHARING IS...KAREN

Have you heard the motto "sharing is caring?" It is a popular Biblical theme and trademarked by The Salvation Army. Here at SHALOM, we are fortunate to have our volunteer Karen Monitz who puts "sharing is caring" into action twice a week at the SHALOM Woolery and Farm.

The Lord planted a seed in Karen's heart for SHALOM when her son. Michael, saw our alpacas. She immediately had a desire to work on the farm as a volunteer and tucked that away in her prayer life. Two years later she was invited to the SHALOM Woolery Spring Bazaar. Karen paid a visit, was introduced to Lon and given a tour. Karen recalls, "I was so impressed with the Christian mission, and the warm welcome I received from Woolery Participants, that I knew I was meant to be here."

Karen developed a place in her heart for people living with disabilities at a young age.

She recalls, "I had a best friend in 2nd grade who was deaf. She was such an artist. I feel gifted with the ability to develop rapport with those with special God-given gifts. This is how I see SHA-LOM Participants."

Karen attended WMU with a double major in Speech Pathology/Audiology and Elementary Education while also working at Croyden Avenue School. After graduation, she worked at the Kalamazoo Psychiatric Hospital before transitioning to MDHHS (Michigan Department of Health & Human Services) where she worked for more than 30 years, prior to retirement.

Karen has full-time expertise since her son, who is now 29, was born with a disability. She reveals, "The patience and empathy practiced at SHALOM comes in handy at home as well."

Why does Karen love to volunteer at SHALOM? She feels, "We all are working toward the same goal as children of God. Everyone is caring and nonjudgmental. I've always loved feeling appreciated and needed, and until I started at SHALOM I didn't realize how much I



needed the SHALOM family myself. It is such a loving, caring environment, where we are all learning patience, understanding and compassion. You also learn a lot about yourself. Spending the day with some of my favorite people feeds my soul!"

We appreciate that Karen also attends our worship nights, monthly dinners, bonfires, and cheers on her SHALOM friends at the bowling alley.
